

ORDINANCE NO. 2022-131

**AN ORDINANCE OF THE TOWNSHIP OF OXFORD, ADAMS COUNTY,
PENNSYLVANIA, CREATING A RECREATION BOARD PURSUANT TO
SECTION 2204-OF THE SECOND-CLASS TOWNSHIP CODE**

BE IT ENACTED AND ORDAINED, and it is hereby enacted and ordained by the Board of Supervisors of the Township of Oxford, as follows:

Section 1: The Oxford Township Board of Supervisors hereby creates the Oxford Township Recreation Board to supervise, regulate, equip, and maintain the Township-funded recreation programs and facilities.

Section 2: The Recreation Board shall consist of five (5) Oxford Township residents as members, and shall be appointed by Resolution of the Board of Supervisors at the Board of Supervisors' reorganization meetings as shall be necessary to fill expired terms, at other times as necessary to fill vacancies, and simultaneously with this creation of the Recreation Board.

Section 3: The members of the Recreation Board shall serve five (5) year terms, except that the members first appointed shall be appointed so that the terms of not more than two (2) members expire annually. Members may voluntarily resign or be removed by the Board of Supervisors for dereliction or neglect of duty.

Section 4: The Recreation Board shall elect a chairman, vice-chairman, and a secretary to serve for a period of one year. The Recreation Board may adopt rules and regulations for the conduct of its business.

Section 5: The Recreation Board shall submit an annual report to the Board of Supervisors, including an analysis of the adequacy and effectiveness of community recreation areas, facilities, and leadership.

Section 6: The Recreation Board shall meet quarterly for the purpose of discussing and recommending park and recreation policies and programs for the Township to the Board of Supervisors.

Section 7: This Ordinance shall take effect and be in full force and effective five (5) days from the date of enactment by the Board of Supervisors.
